Introduction by MC Denise; Welcome to Country performed by Deidre Currie; Poem from Jasmin and; Aboriginal Kids Dance



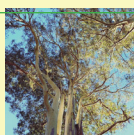
10.45AM Karen Compost Queen

Jason, Bob, Martha, Mo, Mike & Mic perform their second set for the day (1/2 hr approx). Followed by a recorded ambient music break



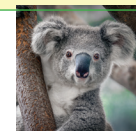
2.15PM JB & the Mmmms
